I remember when I first came to the prison I am now many years ago. I had just gotten out of the S.H.U. after my first S.H.U. term. Another lifer from the S.H.U. and I decided to cell up together. We had a history of heroin use. Right from the start, we both turned to drugs to find some comfort in being in prison with a life sentence.

I noticed that my addiction kept progressing when our neighbor asked us to start selling for him. That marked the point when we got really out of control.

We used more and more drugs. We were always getting high. But the heroin that I craved was in short supply. So I got lost in crystal meth. The more I used it, the more violent I became. I was a drug addict.

I used drugs to cover-up my pain, but in the end it only made things worse for me. Two years later, I found myself going back to the S.H.U.

It was during that last S.H.U. term that God got a hold of my heart. I repented for the sins that I was lost in. At times I still crave drugs, but with the help of God, I don't use anymore. My joy today comes through prayer, not through a needle.

MEDITATION: POSSESSED

in the early morning i had gone down by the water to be with god it was dark there was a silence at that time of day reflecting during these days of all the possessed of capernaum some really wanted to change

god

sometimes i wonder where you are when i listen to the stories of these ones it is like a dark cloud that has taken over their hearts they live but it is not like they are really living

yesterday afternoon as the sun was setting a man came to where i was speaking i could see his heart as he began to speak how he treated his wife the blows to her i could see abba the faces of his children inside of his heart and i felt sad seeing such potential but he was never at home and they were young they needed a father

i felt powerless when he came to talk his heart was surrounded by a dark cloud how many people in this country have i met whose hearts have been taken over by this darkness? before i could say anything he ran off because he knew i could read his heart

sitting here with you abba i pray for this man i pray for all who are possessed like he is there is such darkness within that to kill another would mean nothing to him what do you do when you are in front of those whose hearts are cold?

looking out at the lake as it was changing colors i was feeling a sadness sweep through me just as the wind off the lake was sweeping across the water

it was now time to walk back into the village to begin another day

wandering up to the synagogue to be free to not be ruled by any powers that want to rule over the heart

how important it is to keep the heart free to be full of light and love the powers that drive so many to actions that fill others with darkness

seeing my friends we began to walk toward the synagogue

it was a beautiful day the sun was out now it was warm vou could look down from the synagogue and see the lake below i was still thinking of the man i met yesterday possessed by darkness did he want to change and cast off the power that had taken control of his heart? the look in his eyes still haunts me what must have happened so that he could breathe in so much darkness?

i was glad that i could come here and listen to the word listen to the voice of my abba the synagogue was inviting this morning i wanted to get away from this darkness

we walked in through large doors this place to reflect on what was happening inside and outside we walked through the doors making our way to sit when the same man who came to me yesterday sees me

i felt shocked to find him here but it is clear he is looking for me he falls on his knees and says jesus i implore you i beg you after i talked with you yesterday i could not sleep all night i feel as if i am drowning i want to rid myself of this darkness but i have no control over it it has taken over me the first thing i did last night after seeing you was become intoxicated i didn't want this i promised my family i would not do this anvmore when i got home i saw the faces of my children they were hungry they wanted my attention but i left the house

there was a stillness within the synagogue no one was moving not one sound the man was screaming for help

i remembered back to the time with my abba in the morning in a loud voice i loudly commanded the darkness controlling his heart to leave

all of a sudden as a dark presence escaped the synagogue a real change of temperature was felt the man lay on the ground totally exhausted

i went over and picked him up this time he did not try to run away he had let go of this darkness that was possessing him his heart was free again

lines of gratitude spread across his once very troubled face thank you jesus for taking away this evil that i had chosen i felt powerless to free myself

yesterday when i talked to you i wanted to free myself but i was not ready never again do i want to go back to how i was possessed by powers of death

he walked out the door of the synagogue free he walked to his house and became the husband he never was the father he never was he always remembered back to that morning in the synagogue when this one freed him from the darkness he never missed going to the synagogue to thank god for this healing
