I wasn't doing anything to help myself. For more than a decade after my arrest, I continued my criminal behavior and gang lifestyle, yet I believed I would get out. Little by little I continued to walk down a dark tunnel, and the longer I walked through it the darker it got. There was no light in sight.

It wasn't till one day, I learned about SB 261. Then I was able to finally see a light in the dark tunnel that my life had become. Hope was brought into my life.

That day, I did a deep soul search and was finally able to pinpoint what it was that had driven me into a life of crime. Even though it was an event that marked my life, by no means does it justify my life of crime or actions, but it helps me attack that problem from the root.

I want to go home to be a real father to my daughter, a good son to my mother and good citizen to society. I am going to work so hard into my rehabilitation to make it impossible for the board panel to deny my parole. Whether you're active, inactive, or a dropout, we all need hope and love.

John answered them all, saying, "I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire." Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.
