
INTRODUCTION

LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Joel 2:12-18

"When you pray, do not be like the hypocrites, who love to stand and pray in the synagogues and on street corners so that others may see them. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you. "When you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites. They neglect their appearance, so that they may appear to others to be fasting. Amen, I say to you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, so that you may not appear to be fasting, except to your Father who is hidden. And your Father who sees what is hidden will repay you."

do we decide to change with the mind? do we one day wake up and change? is it when we see what we have done by our actions? is it when we have nowhere else to turn?

john continued to speak to the crowds: change your ways look at your life how do you need to change? do not change for one day because you are suffering change your ways

jesus was showing me a young girl who was walking alone to the river all her life she had been abused and suffered greatly for a long time but one day she was walking under the stars late at night and a presence overtook her she knew she was in the presence of god her whole being felt this

the following week she began to open up her heart to pray deeply

today she is walking to the river to tell god that she really wants to change change really has something to do with a relationship with the connection and love that is birthed from the relationship this is what lets us change

listening to john again: open your hearts do not be afraid if you are attached to any darkness let go change your behavior if you are not walking in the light change your ways

listening to john's voice getting louder: don't sell your souls be careful with who you are following do not be slaves to darkness you need to be freed it will not be easy

seeing this from the hillside i watched the girl jesus pointed out to me i could hear her saying jesus i will change i will no longer dedicate my life to acts of death for revenge and hate i choose life and she walked to the middle of the river where iohn immersed her when she emerged

her face was radiant she had made the decision to change never again would she return to her old ways with this attitude she could find real genuine love in her life

and i too was ready
to free myself of
ways of darkness
after that afternoon
being with jesus
and listening to john
talk about change
i needed to stop
judging others by race
by the color of their skin
i do not want to
make fun of
another person

i realized
we are equally loved
by our god
how wrong it is to
look down on another
because of their
race or class
i realized how
i needed to never again
be violent against others
