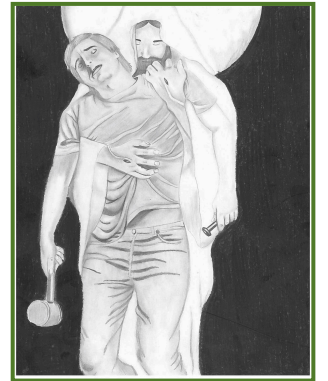

I want to show people that not everyone in prison stays bad; some of us can change into people of faith, and some of us will learn that our old lifestyles are what put us here.

For me, it started by attending groups. I remember when I attended my first retreat. I allowed myself to be vulnerable to share something deep with others. I always thought being vulnerable made you weak, but it is the exact opposite. It feels like a huge weight leaves your back.

Through our writings, meditating, and group sharing, I can understand the pain I have caused my victims and their families. I've learned that the only way to begin healing yourself is to talk about it with others going through it with you and through prayer. God gives to all who ask him.

I feel like I am one more step closer to healing my wounds and letting go of all anger and bitterness. I know the road is going to be long and hard in prison, but with God's grace and the help of those around me, I will finish the road before me.

Everyone who acknowledges me before others I will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

we talked about

to be the biggest

jesus talked about
when he first

and the challenges

along the way

about jesus
i had not seen before

this deep desire
that moved him
to leave
all the security
of nazareth
to risk everything
animated him

then we embraced
